COURSE AIM:

By the end of the course the students will be able to independently create graphic design and compose visual information. The students will be able to synthesise text and image as crucial elements of visual information and apply the rules of typography in their compositions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

The student should be able to express art through graphic design (typography, composition, drawing, knowledge of colours). The student should have a basic knowledge of graphic programmes applied in vector graphics, text editing, and work with bit maps. The student should also demonstrate an awareness of printing techniques and technology of print. Advanced computer skills an ability to use graphic programmes Corel Draw, Adobe Suite (Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign). The students should be able to compose a text and picture and should know the basics of graphic design.

COURSE CONTENTS:

The students have all opportunities to clearly realise their projects through the use of computer peripherals, drawing and painting labs. according to the syllabus. Tools such as: scanner, digital camera, plotter, peripherals are available for the students to carry out their tasks. During classes, the students produce compositions based on letterer's craft and typography. The students design graphic signs, compose company prints, fliers and leaflets. The students are familiarised with basic graphic problems connected with public space design. The students work both individually and in a group.

TEACHING METHODS:

The students will have the opportunity to realise their projects in class using the peripherals and software provided. One to one tutorials give the students an opportunity to make their own, individuals design decisions. The students also prepare their own materials and work outside the lab. Visual materials, multimedia presentation and discussions are part of the course. The students also have access and make use of to the University's virtual learning network.
